## **Questions for Discussion**

- 1. What words would you use to describe Rebecca based on this scene? What can we learn from this scene about the woman who will become Isaac's wife, one of the four matriarchs in Jewish tradition?
- 2. According to Robert Alter, in this scene Rebecca is presented, "...as a continuous whirl of purposeful activity. In four short verses (Gen. 24:16, 18-20) she is the subject of eleven verbs of action and one of speech, going down to the well, drawing water, filling the pitcher, pouring, giving drink.... In her actions and speech we see her energy, her considerate courtesy, her sense of quiet self-possession". (*The Art of Biblical Narrative*, pp. 53-54)
  - What connections do you see between the image of Rebecca presented by Alter and your work as coordinators? How would you characterize the value of your role within The RE-IMAGINE Project?
- 3. Keeping in mind the image of the well, while you are busy drawing water for the Leadership Team and the Task Force, how can you be sure that you are also able to "drink your fill"?
